OPIOID ADDICTION: A NATIONWIDE EPIDEMIC

The U.S. continues to struggle with the nationwide epidemic stemming from misuse of prescription and illicit drugs.



Part of this epidemic can be addressed through efforts to increase treatment and prevention evidence based practices in Mississippi, including increased access to **Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)**.

WHAT IS MAT?

MAT is the use of medications, in combination with psychosocial counseling and behavioral therapies, to provide a "whole-patient" approach to the treatment of opioid dependence.

DOES MAT WORK?

MAT programs provide safe and controlled levels of medication to overcome the use of abused opioids.

Research shows that with the proper administration of the appropriate dose along with patient compliance, medications used in MAT will not have adverse effects on a person's intelligence, mental capability, physical functioning, or employability.
