IN THE U.S.:

Opioids (including prescription opioids, heroin and synthetic opioids) killed an estimated 107,000 people in 2022.



The number of overdose deaths in 2021 was **10 times** the number in **1999**.

Opioid involved deaths increased by over **15%** from **2020 - 2021**

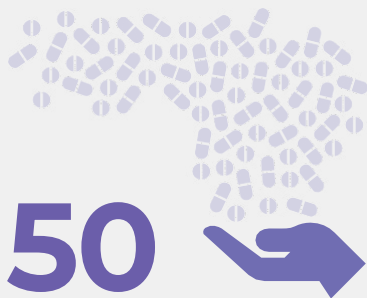

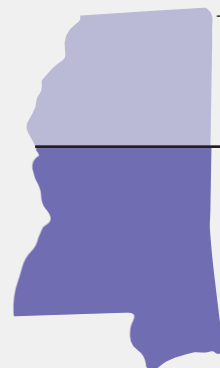
OF OPIOID OVERDOSE DEATHS INVOLVED

WHAT CAN I DO?

PREVENT OPIOID DEATHS

- **Take charge of your health.** Educate yourself on prescription and synthetic opioids and the potential dangers of misuse.
- **Talk to your healthcare provider about alternative pain management options.**
- **Discuss the dangers of opioid misuse with your family,** especially children and young adults.
- **Practice safe storage** and dispose of unused prescription medication properly.
- **Avoid ANY** pills that are not prescribed to you. **One pill could be deadly.**

RECOGNIZING AN OPIOID OVERDOSE

Learning the warning signs of overdose could save lives. However, it may be difficult to spot the symptoms.

SIGNS MAY INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

- Small, constricted “pinpoint pupils”
- Falling asleep or loss of consciousness
- Slow, shallow breathing
- Choking or gurgling sounds
- Limp body
- Pale, blue, grayish or ashen cold skin



**CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY
IF YOU SUSPECT
AN OVERDOSE.**

The Mississippi Medical Emergency Good Samaritan Act can provide immunity from arrest or prosecution for certain drug violations if you call for help for yourself or a friend who is experiencing a drug overdose.
